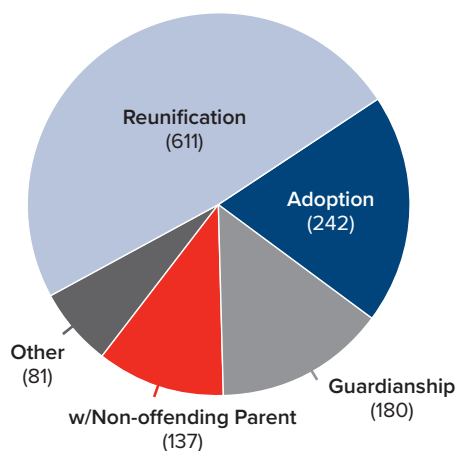

PERMANENCY COMPOSITION

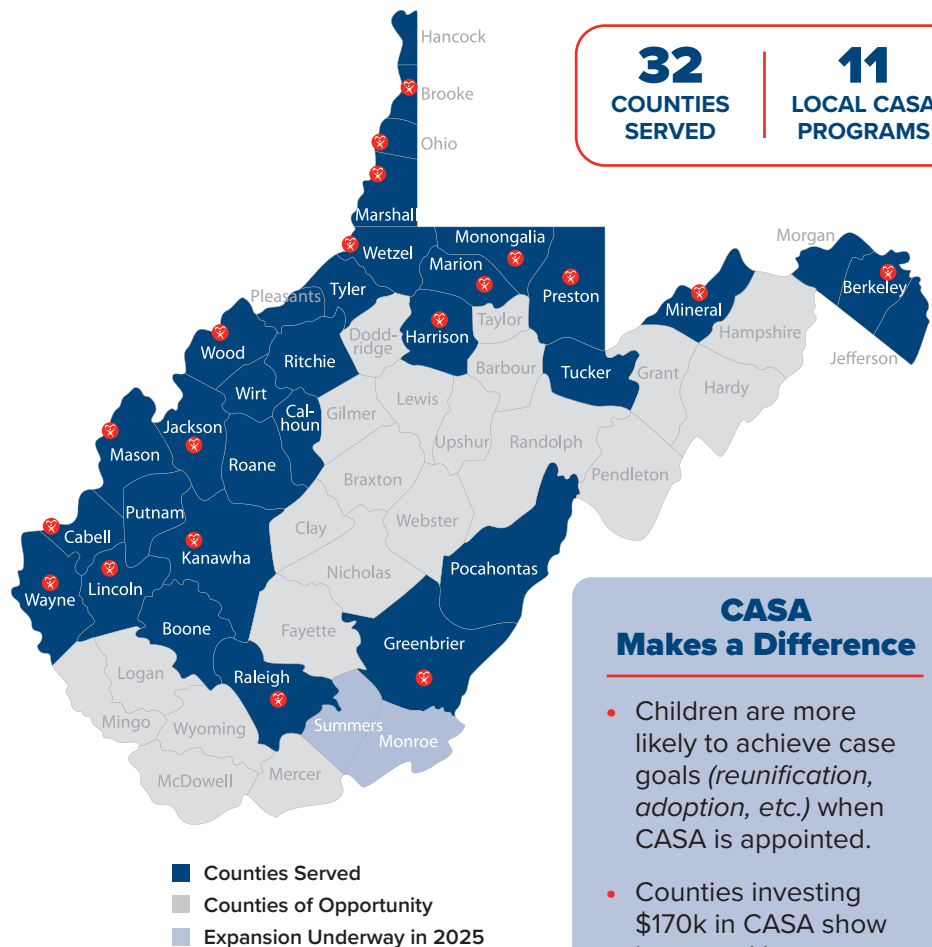

CASA Makes a Difference

- Children are more likely to achieve case goals (*reunification, adoption, etc.*) when CASA is appointed.
- Counties investing \$170k in CASA show increased long-term outcomes for children

Children with a CASA advocate on their team spend an average of 3 months less in foster care
